

ACER-CART Executive Director Chosen

The Canadian Association of Retired Teachers (ACER-CART) has appointed a new executive director. Norbert Boudreau of Nepean, Ontario will replace Pierre Drouin, who had resigned effective December, 2008.



A retired teacher, Boudreau is a graduate of Ottawa's St. Pat's College where he earned a B.A. (1966), and an M. Ed. from Ottawa University (1980). He received his Ontario principal qualification in 1980-81 and a superintendent qualification in 1980. From 1966-1990 Boudreau taught with the Carleton Board of Education District 27 where he was a teacher, Assistant-Head, Head, and consultant. From 1990-98 he was a teacher and language coordinator with the Upper-Canada District School Board.

Boudreau has had leadership experience with the Retired Teachers of Ontario (RTO/ERO) since 2002. An executive member, newsletter editor and past president of Ottawa-Carleton District 27, he was appointed to the provincial Communications Committee in 2006 and is the current chair. He has also held positions of treasurer, newsletter editor and president of the Canadian Association of Immersion Teachers (1989-94).

The Canadian Association of Retired Teachers represents fourteen retired teachers organizations across Canada with a membership in excess of 160,000 members. It provides liaison and mutual assistance among its member organizations; promotes the interests of its member organizations; develops strategies for joint action on matters of common concern; cooperates with other organizations on matters of common concern; and promotes support for public education.
